Re: Update on Municipal Code Revisions to Open Space & Parks Titles

With the addition of a Ranger Program, the Parks & Recreation Department has been requested to revise the Open Space and Park titles of the Municipal Code. Over the past few months, there have been several discussions among Open Space, Park and Legal staff to identify gaps in the code and desired revisions. Currently, the Departmental recommended Municipal Code revisions have been evaluated by OSAB and are set to go to Legal staff for review and finalization. Final revisions will be presented to City Council on May 15th, 2018 for First Reading and June 5th, 2018 for Second Reading.

The goals of the Municipal Code revisions are as follows:

1. Revise code to be more straight forward and digestible by the general public.
2. Group like Ordinances under umbrella Categories.
3. Make Open Space and Parks Titles as similar as possible (like ordinances at beginning and unique at bottom).
4. Give Director and duly authorized employees the ability to complete their daily duties.
5. Allow the Rangers to better enforce the law, ensure safety of users, generate compliance and perform duties.

While reading the following Recommended Municipal Code Revisions spreadsheet, please keep the following formatting notes in mind: The Open Space and Parks divisions will retain separate Municipal Code Titles; however, in order to meet Goals 3 & 5, the language in each Ordinance will be *virtually* identical in each Title. Existing Open Space Ordinances are listed in Dark Green in the left-hand column and existing Parks Ordinances are listed in Dark Orange in the right-hand column. The center column contains the proposed language for the new, revised Ordinances. Red text indicates changes and omissions made to existing language. A Joint Ordinance Key can be found on Page 10 of the document indicating the meaning of each color for the Joint Ordinance.

1 Risk Clause (See #31)	It is the responsibility of all persons entering Open Space/Park Land to know and abide by the rules and regulations of the City, as provided in this chapter and elsewhere in this code, the rules and regulations promulgated by the Director, and the instructions and directions of duly authorized agents, employees or law enforcement officers of the City acting in their official capacity.
2 Destruction of Wildlife Habitat (Added to #18?)	It shall be unlawful to by any means (i) take, seize, feed, pursue, trap, harass, disturb, molest, injure or hunt any bird, reptile, livestock or animal on Open Space/Park Land. Fish are an exception in areas posted specifically for that purpose and in compliacne with the game, fish and wildlife laws of the state, or (ii) take, seize, disturb, destroy, or remove wildlife habiatat.
3 General Hazardous Activity	It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in any careless or reckless behavior or activity on Open Space/Park land that constitutes a hazard to their safety or to the safety of other visitors.
4 Eluding/Interference (Authority?)	It shall be unlawful while on Open Space/Park land to knowingly obstruct, impair, or hinder the performance of the official duties of a Ranger Naturalist by, without limitation, failure to comply with a lawful request to immediately leave City-Owned Property, eluding or evading a Ranger Naturalist, harassment of a Ranger Naturalist, or providing flase or misleading information with the intent to misleading the Ranger Naturalist in the performance of their duties.
5 Smoking/MJ	It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke or carry any lighted smoking instrument while on Open Space/Park land, or place where smoking is prohibited by sign.
6 OS and Park Home Rule Charter Definitions	"Open space" or "open space land" means land that is included in the open space zone district pursuant to Section 15-3. "Park land" means land acquired or owned in whole or in part by the City that is: (1) Designated, maintained, or reserved by the City for suce recreation uses as are not prohibited by the City; or (2) Compsed primarily of irrigated turf designed for public use.
