Call to Order – Chairperson Tennessen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Approval of Agenda – Chairperson Tennessen called for changes to the agenda. Machado moved to approve the agenda as presented. Carlson seconded. All in favor. Agenda approved.

Tennessee called for any changes to the consent agenda. Carlson moved to approve the consent agenda, Machado seconded. All in favor. Consent agenda approved.

Authority Business

- A. Public Hearing – New Application for Beer and Wine License – Refuge Décor LLC – 1132 W. Dillon Road #4

Chairperson Tennessee opened the public hearing on the beer and wine liquor license application. Secretary Hanson stated the application was complete and included in the Authority packet. Background checks were conducted and returned showing no criminal history. The hearing had been posted and published in accordance with state law. There was no reason found to require denial of the application.

Chairperson Tennessee called for any member disclosures. Authority member Lipton noted she had met the owner of the business, as a customer, but did not feel it would interfere with her judgement on the application.

Chairperson Tennessee called for any objections to the boundaries of the neighborhood being the current city limits of the City of Louisville. Hearing no objections, he moved the entire application be made a part of the record of this hearing. Lipton seconded. All in favor.

Chairperson Tennessee called for the applicant to take the oath and proceed with a presentation. Randi McClanahan, 1711 Alma Lane, Superior, CO 80027 introduced herself to the Authority and took the oath.

Mike Laszlo, Laszlo and Associates, attorney for the applicant introduced himself to the Authority and handed Secretary Hanson a business owner survey the applicant had done. Secretary Hanson gave the survey to the Chair.

Mr. Laszlo directed questions to Randi McClanahan. She reported the business is a furniture consignment store where as owner she would like to create an atmosphere, not just a place to shop. The store has opened, and is open from 10am to 6pm Monday through Thursday and from 10am to 6:30pm on Friday and Saturday. The anticipation is alcohol would only be served from around noon until close. Sandwiches, frozen burritos and cheese and crackers will be available. The hope is the offering of beer and wine will entice customers to return and enjoy the shop. Most customers are adults, the store will be family oriented and the anticipation is not to charge for the alcohol, but to offer a small pour of beer or wine while the customers are shopping. Signage will be posted at the door to note no alcohol can leave the premises. From the cash wrap area, there is a clear sight line of the entire store where alcohol would be consumed. The alcohol would be stored in a back room where customers are not allowed. The alcohol service would occur at the cash wrap and any bottles will be out of reach of customers. Ms. McClanahan and her husband are the only employees and will both be taking alcohol service classes.

Authority member Carlson asked Ms. McClanahan to further describe the business. She said the store has consignment items; home décor and some gifts. In the future, she might provide home decorating services.

Chairperson Tennessen noted the Individual History for Ms. McClanahan's husband needed to reflect the same position in the company as noted on the application.

Chairperson Tennessen called for any interested parties speaking for or against the application. Hearing neither, he called for any closing statement.

Mr. Laszlo believed the needs and desires of the community will be met, the application is complete and requested the beer and wine license be granted.

Chairperson Tennessen noted the petition showed several businesses had signed in favor of the license.

Mr. Laszlo moved the petition/survey presented earlier be entered as evidence in support of the application. Petition was entered as evidence.

Chairperson Tennessen closed the public hearing and called for Authority comments.

Authority member Machado moved the Local Licensing Authority of the City of Louisville find the applicant is of good moral character, the inhabitants of the neighborhood desire the license be granted; the license will meet the reasonable

requirements of the neighborhood. All City and State law requirements have been met and based on these findings, the Local Licensing Authority approve the issuance of a beer and wine liquor license for Refuge Decor LLC. Lipton seconded. Roll Call Vote – Machado – yes, Lipton – yes, Tennessen – yes, Carlson – yes and Hervey – yes. License approved.

B. Set Boundaries of Neighborhood and Public Hearing – New Application for Hotel and Restaurant Liquor License – OYSY, Inc. d/b/a Sushi Yoshi Restaurant – 917 Front Street Suite 100

Lipton moved the boundaries of the neighborhood be set as the city limits of the City of Louisville for the new liquor license application for OYSY, Inc. d/b/a Sushi Yoshi Restaurant and the public hearing be set for June 27, 2016 at 7:00 PM. Machado seconded. All in favor.

C. Discussion/Direction – Rules of Procedure

Authority Attorney Culley stated there could be some amendments to the rules of procedure to address the concerns the Authority has been discussing. She suggested one change could be to include a phrase saying State suspensions are not to be considered in imposing local suspensions. Any other changes the Authority desires could be done before the next meeting.

Authority Attorney Culley suggested one potential change to make the process run smoother would be to set a show cause hearing two meetings out to allow for a stipulation to be presented at the next meeting. If the Authority chooses, they could reject the stipulation and hold the hearing as scheduled or give an opportunity for an amended stipulation to be presented. This would not require a change to the rules but could become a practice when show cause hearings are ordered.

Authority members discussed the benefits and disadvantages of following that procedure and decided they could try it in the future.

Authority members discussed whether State violations should be considered when imposing penalties for a local violation. Chairperson Tennessen suggested the Authority not change the rules at this point, but remember the Authority can reject a stipulation in any future show cause orders if they have a problem with the way the penalty was determined.

Secretary's Report

Hanson reported City Council had a public hearing on the ordinance to change the hours of operation for the marijuana stores. They ultimately decided to extend the hours for both medical and retail stores, but only until 10 p.m. Authority members remarked they had heard from citizens expressing their dislike for the large sign facing McCaslin that one of the marijuana businesses is displaying.

Hanson stated a special seller/server training for the Street Faire volunteers had been held.

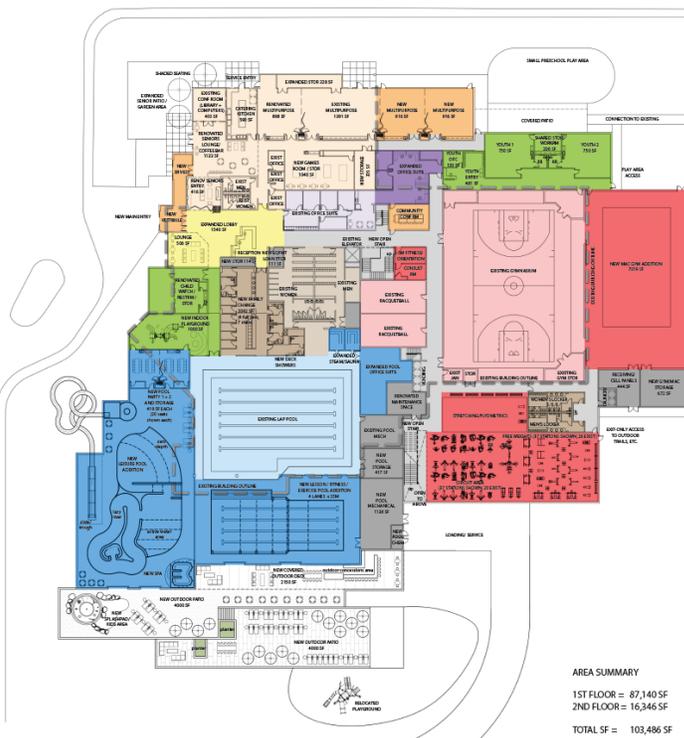

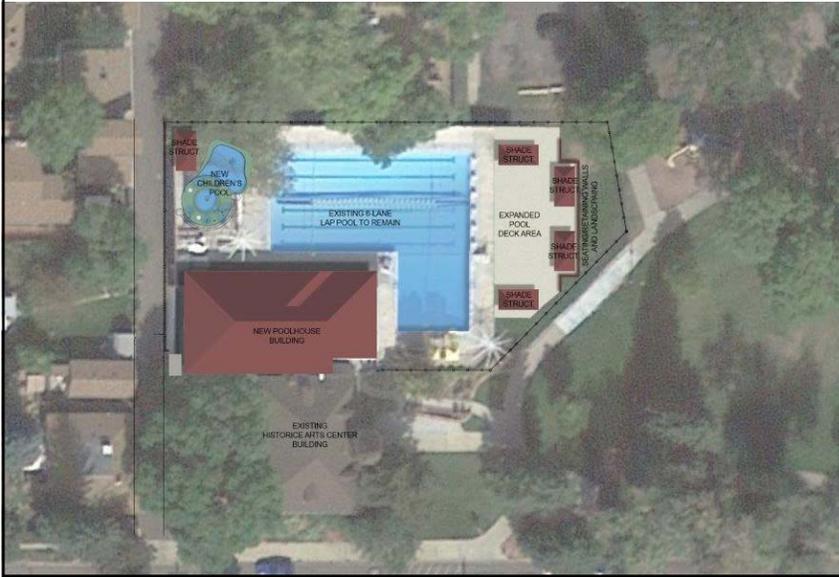

Public Finance Considerations

- Property tax proposed to finance capital construction.
- A \$28 million project would amount to an annual increase of \$123 on a \$500,000 home, based on 2.50% interest rate for a 20-year bond.
- Annual operations and maintenance costs estimated at \$500,000 would be financed through a voter-approved sales tax of approximately 20 cents on every \$100 spent.
- The following schedule is an estimate of the additional property and sales taxes required to pay back various size debt issuances. The amounts will actually depend on interest rates, bond ratings, property valuations, etc.

Next Steps

- Language is being drafted for the two ballot issues that must pass for this project to move forward. The first issue will ask voters to approve a sales tax increase to fund capital construction and the second issue will ask voters to approve a sales tax increase to fund annual operations & maintenance costs.
- If City Council moves forward with these two ballot measures, citizens will vote on them Nov. 8. **(Both measures must pass!)**
