City of Louisville Invites Community to Help Improve Transportation

The City of Louisville is developing its first Transportation Master Plan (TMP) that will examine transportation conditions throughout the City and develop recommendations for short- and long-term improvements. To ensure the plan addresses the needs and goals of our community, a meeting will be held on Monday, September 10th at City Hall Council Chambers from 6:00 – 8:00 pm. Please join us to share your ideas and opinions to help shape transportation and mobility options in Louisville.

The community meeting will be an open-house style where you can engage with the project team, participate in multiple activities, and share your thoughts on transportation today in Louisville and what is needed for the future. A short presentation will begin at 6:30. Come for ten minutes or stay the entire time! A kid's station will be set up and light refreshments provided.

The TMP will provide a comprehensive framework to guide planning, decision making, and project implementation for all modes of transportation in Louisville over the next 20 years and beyond. The project is currently developing needs, goals, and priorities based on community and City feedback to focus development of the plan and recommendations. The plan will consider all ways that people move around Louisville and how the transportation network can best accommodate the community's needs.
