9. Discussion on Use of Herbicides in Parks

- **Discussion on current process:** The City follows more of a containment approach to weeds: broadleaf (ex dandelion) application is in the spring only. No herbicides in greenways. Glyphosate used for spot-spraying in sidewalk cracks, shrub beds, etc.
- City Council work plan for 2020 includes the review of the Integrated Weed Management Plan.
- History: in 2008 the City stopped spraying all weeds and received negative feedback from folks due to the look of the parks in the community. Decision was then reversed to allow the use of herbicides when needed. In 2017, the City stopped spraying all playgrounds and received positive feedback.
- **Discussion on Modifications:** The City of Boulder uses a highly restricted herbicide plan in their parks. Marketing and communication materials highlight the policy and communicate to residents and guests regarding the restricted herbicide use and the implications in the parks, increased broadleaf weeds.
- Allison Johanson: Sustainability Advisory Board: Comments on using parts of the Boulder County herbicide use plan. Interest in mitigating the negative effects of herbicides. Proactive management of common areas to foster health and sustainability. Looking to foster positive changes to limit herbicide use, ie: an integrated weed management plan (mechanical, biological and limited herbicide use). Discussion around collaborating with the Sustainability Advisory Board.
- Tracy Geagan, guest: Presented interest in limited/no herbicide use. Concerned about marketing tactics of companies who produce herbicides using misleading information. Discussion around the “drift” of 2,4-D as applications can make their way to private property ½ mile or more away from spray sites. City uses 2,4-D in the spring and communicates to adjacent homeowners ahead of time. Discussion around community education on natural lawn care. CSU Extension office is a great resource; the City has not taken this on recently.
- Debbie Davies, guest and beekeeper: Presented interest in no herbicide use. Feels that we have a picture of green, pristine parks and would like the City to get away from that. Has lost several hives over the years. Discussion around city issues such as the community proportion of for vs. against spraying and the possibility of litigation surrounding spraying of herbicides.
- Board Discussion: We can evaluate the process of neighboring municipalities (ex. Boulder) and adopt practices that will have a positive impact on Louisville. Adopt marketing strategies to communicate impacts of limited herbicide use (ex. Increased dandelions). Discussion around a balanced approach and a step-wise approach.
- Discussion around marketing campaigns as we work towards a step-wise approach. Possible use of Community Park as a pilot program and area to market a move towards limited herbicide use.
- Board Discussion around incremental approach to herbicide reduction; maintaining herbicide use in sports fields while limiting/eliminating herbicide use in playgrounds and surrounding turf. Possible expansion of Adopt a Park program.
- We as a Board feel strongly about reducing the application of herbicides in playgrounds and surrounding turf. We recommend the development of a marketing campaign to foster public awareness and support as we move towards herbicide reduction and elimination in select parks.

Subject: Discussion and Prioritization on Capital Improvement Requests

Purpose:

The purpose of this agenda item is to gain feedback from PPLAB on suggested capital improvement projects to occur in 2021 and 2022, and up to year 2026 for future planning.

Background:

What is a Capital Improvement Project?

A Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is a planning process that identifies the capital investments a local government intends to make over a period of time. Capital, for a local government, constitutes the facilities and materials needed to perform the jurisdiction's functions and to produce and deliver the services expected of it. Generally speaking, capital improvements are assets that are unique, fixed in place (relatively), permanent or which have long useful lives, and are (relatively) expensive. The City's capitalization threshold is \$5,000.

While a CIP does not cover routine maintenance, it does include renovation, major repair, or reconstruction of damaged or deteriorated facilities. While capital improvements do not usually include furniture and equipment, capital project may include the furniture and equipment clearly associated with newly constructed or renovated facility or furniture and equipment that is significant in cost.

The City of Louisville's CIP includes expenditures for buildings, land, parks, water and sewer plants, acquisition of water rights, sidewalks, streets and curbs, storm drains, major equipment and other commodities which are of significant value and have a useful life of several years.

The planning period for the City's CIP is six years. The expenditures proposed for the first year of the program are incorporated into the Annual Budget.

Subject: Discussion on Future Operational Budget Funding Requests

Purpose:

The purpose of this agenda item is to gain feedback from PPLAB on suggested operational budget increases or decreases to occur in years 2021 and 2022.

Background:

What is an Operational Budget?

An operational budget is an annual budget that is utilized to provide resources to support the performance of the operation. More simply stated, the operational budgets in this case fund routine maintenance. Within operational budgets are cost accounts that support routine maintenance such as personnel salaries, supplies, professional services, parts, etc.

Where Can I Find the Operational Budgets for Parks?

The Park Division's operational funding is primarily housed under the following operational budgets listed as sub-programs in the, "2019-2020 Biennial Budget Supplemental Report".

- Parks Administration & Operations (p. 187)
- Cemetery Administration & Operations (p. 193)
- Streetscapes (p. 167)
- Snow & Ice Removal (p. 185)
- Athletic Field Maintenance (p. 205)

Feedback from PPLAB

Although the review of each operational budget will be informative, for purposes of this discussion it is not necessary. Comments provided by PPLAB could be as big picture as for example, "would like to see an improvement with mowing". These types of comments are informative enough whereas staff will know which cost account the feedback relates to.

As mentioned, included within the operational budgets are personnel salaries as well as professional services funds or contractual funds. For purposes of this discussion, feedback regarding contractual versus in-house work would be appropriate as well as commenting on full-time position requests. Current full-time position needs from a staff perspective are: arborist, horticulturist, athletic fields maintenance technician, and turf cultural maintenance technician.

Next Steps:

After review and discussion, staff will take into consideration any feedback PPLAB provides and forward along to City Council as appropriate.

Re: Cottonwood Master Plan Task Force

Background

In 2020 the Parks, Recreation and Open Space Department has money allocated to complete a conceptual master plan for the Cottonwood Park (including the former church property) and Lake Park areas. This master plan will gather input from staff, residents and city boards and commissions to create a vision for recreational enhancements and amenities that could be incorporated at the site.

To make the process as efficient as possible, staff has determined that the formation of a Task Force consisting of two (2) members of each advisory board (PPLAB, Open Space Advisory Board, and Recreation Advisory Board) and approximately 3-5 at-large residents would be beneficial. This Task Force will work with staff and consultants to provide input, evaluate options and help further engage interested residents in the master plan process.

Participation in the Task Force would require approximately one (1) meeting a month for a 6-8 month commitment. There could be additional meetings or public outreach events scheduled as needed. Our goal is to meet only as often as necessary to keep the project moving forward.

Next Steps

Staff is asking PPLAB members to consider participation in the Task Force. During the February meeting we will ask for formal nominations of Task Force representatives from PPLAB and a vote to confirm them.

Re: Outdoor Recreation Amenity Sub-Committee Results

Background

In May of 2019 a sub-committee of staff, Recreation Advisory Board (RAB) members and Parks and Public Landscaping Advisory Board (PPLAB) members was formed to investigate and gather feedback from the public regarding current satisfaction with outdoor recreational amenities and future needs. Information from this process is meant to inform future planning processes in general and specifically the Cottonwood Park Master Plan process and the Recreation & Senior Center Campus Master Plan update that are planned to occur in the next couple of years.

The sub-committee drafted a non-scientific survey to gain feedback from interested residents and visitors. The survey was administered through Survey Monkey. The survey was taken by more than 850 individuals. Staff compiled department information and submitted that information to the National Recreation and Parks Association as part of that organizations national park metrics comparison. Sub-committee members and staff also gathered comparison data from other local, regional and state municipalities to provide additional information on which to compare Louisville's level of service to others and identify trends in outdoor recreation amenities that could be incorporated in our park system.

Survey Results

Respondent Demographics

884 individuals responded to the Louisville Outdoor Athletic Amenity Survey. The survey was not meant to be scientifically valid, but rather provide a snapshot of what residents and visitors think of how we are meeting their current needs and what areas the City might want to invest when updating current facilities or developing new outdoor recreational amenities within the city. The entire survey results are included as Appendix A.

Of the respondents, 59% were female and 41% were male. The largest group to respond was individuals aged 35-54 with 58% of the respondents. Other age groups responded as

follows: under 35, 6%; 55-64, 19%; 65-74, 14%; and 75 and over, 3%. Respondents were fairly evenly distributed based on how long they have lived in Louisville. Around 39% have lived in Louisville for less than 10 years. 24% have lived in the City between 10 and 20 years. 23% have lived in the community for 21 or more years. 14% of respondents are not residents of the city. 51% of respondents were couples with children. Couples with children no longer at home and couples with no children were the next largest groups at 22% and 10% respectively. Single residents made up 16% of those that responded.

Survey Responses

The survey questions are listed below with a summary of responses.

Q1 – Which outdoor athletic amenities do you personally use in Louisville or elsewhere?

With 47.22% of respondents tennis courts were the number one amenity identified. With a combined 41.5% of respondents, soccer/multi-purpose fields were the second highest used amenity. 22% of respondents use the golf course. 20.5% use baseball/softball fields.

Q2 – Which outdoor athletic amenities do other adults in your household use?

Answers to this question mirror responses to Q1 with tennis being first, soccer/multi-purpose fields being second, followed by golf course and baseball/softball fields.

Q3 – Which outdoor athletic amenities do children under 18 years old in your household use?

With a combined 53% soccer/multi-purpose fields led use by children. In second place are tennis courts (25%). Third place was baseball/softball fields (23%). The City's skate park and basketball courts were fourth and fifth with 22% and 18%. All other responses were in the single percentage of respondents.

Q4 – How often do you and your family visit each facility?

See full survey results for data.

Q5 – In which areas do you think Louisville's need for outdoor athletic facilities is being met for the immediate future?

Respondents felt that the communities' needs are currently being met in the following areas, Soccer/Multi-purpose fields (47%), golf course (42%), skate park (36%), tennis courts (33%) and baseball/softball fields (32%).

Q6 – What do you think Louisville's single biggest need is for outdoor athletic amenities?

The following areas received the largest responses regarding need for additional amenities: tennis courts (27%), soccer/multi-purpose fields (20%), and bike/pump track (12%).

Q7 - If you could allocate \$100 to new outdoor recreation facilities, how would you allocate the 100?

A weighted average were applied to respondents' answers. The following areas had the most money allocated to them: Soccer Fields. Tennis courts, bike/Pump track and baseball/softball fields.

Comparative Data Results

Staff and sub-committee members collected comparative data from the National Recreation and Parks Association (NRPA) and thirteen Colorado cities including Arvada, Boulder, Brighton, Broomfield, Erie, Golden, Glenwood Springs, Lafayette, Longmont, Loveland, Montrose, Parker and Thornton. This information compares the types of amenities and how many are available within Louisville against national and state benchmark data. The comparative data is included in Appendix B.

Local and Regional Comparisons

Staff and sub-committee members gathered information on 30 core outdoor amenities across communities. Other types of outdoor amenities were also collected based on the types of facilities a community had, but are not directly compared.

Of those 30 amenity types, Louisville has equal or more facilities than the average of comparative cities in five categories. The areas include Ice rinks, cricket fields, synthetic fields, bocce ball and bmx/pump tracks. When comparing Louisville facilities to other similar sized Colorado cities we are equal to or have more facilities than the average of comparative similar sized cities in 15 of the 30 categories. The categories include those already mentioned as well as playgrounds, golf courses, basketball, multi-use basketball/volleyball, tennis courts, pickleball courts, multi-use tennis courts, baseball/softball fields, inline skate rinks, and outdoor pools.

We also gathered data related to annual operating and capital budgets. While capital budgets can fluctuate annually, operating budgets are more stable. Dividing the annual operating budget by the residents in the community you get an operating expenditure per capita amount. Louisville currently spends \$124 per resident related to Parks, Recreation and Open Space. This compares favorably to the national per capita spending of \$78.69 supplied by NRPA. But is less than the average of comparison cities in Colorado, which spend \$213 on average per resident.

These comparisons provide information on whether we have similar amounts of facilities but does not rate the quality of the amenity. This is an important factor that must be taken into account when analyzing the information and making decisions on potential future investments.

NRPA Comparisons

The NRPA data is provided by parks and recreation departments throughout the United States and Canada. This information allows
Of the 30 categories we collected data, the City of Louisville exceeded or was equal to NRPA data in 6 categories (Playgrounds, Tennis Courts, ice rinks, cricket fields, synthetic fields and golf courses). NRPA did not have comparative data for the following categories: pickleball, bocce, inline skate rinks, and bmx/pump tracks.

Data Analysis

Survey Analysis

While the survey is not scientifically valid, it was taken by a wide range of residents and visitors and provides valuable insight into what amenities are currently meeting community demand and what types of amenities the City of Louisville should consider when reinvesting in current facilities or developing new ones.

But these responses and the data collected are only part of the analysis that needs to take place to interpret the information and turn it into action. An example from the survey includes the responses to Q5 related to what amenities are currently meeting the needs of the community. The amenity that respondent's rate highest regarding meeting current needs was soccer/multi-purposes fields. The City of Louisville is able to meet the community's needs in this area currently, but none of the fields that are used are under the City's direct control. The City relies on Boulder Valley School District (BVSD) to provide field space in order to meet the needs of our community. So while we are currently meeting this need, investing in multi-purpose fields that we schedule and maintain would provide predictability that we currently do not have.

Regarding current use of facilities by adults. It was interesting that Tennis was the number one amenity used in the community. Louisville has a very active tennis community and a robust local organization, Centennial Valley Tennis Association, which provides opportunities for local residents to participate and compete in the sport. Again, while this survey is not scientifically valid, staff will need to use this information to look for opportunities to expand opportunities for tennis in the community while also realizing that Louisville has more tennis courts compared to NRPA standards and Colorado communities of similar size.

The second most used amenity within the community are our soccer/multi-purpose fields. This is related to programming offered through the recreation center and partnerships with other organizations. The fact that these facilities are so highly used and none are under our control indicate an immediate need to develop multi-purpose fields within Louisville that are owned, scheduled and maintained by the City.

Use of City recreational amenities by children in the community focus on a couple areas. The number one facility used by children is soccer/multi-purpose fields. Again, since none are under the City's direct control, it's essential that more fields are developed in the future. Tennis was the number two amenity used by Children based on survey responses. Our baseball/softball fields was number three. The skate park was number four and basketball courts were number five. These amenities are core to the services we provide in Louisville and it will be important to reinvest in the facilities we currently have and engage residents as we develop new properties to determine which of these and the other amenities that could be included in the park development.

Respondents were asked how often they visited certain amenities as part of the survey. This was meant to help provide data to understand if there might be facilities that would be prioritized over others because of the amount of people that use them frequently. The data provided a weighted average but the scores were so similar it is difficult to draw any conclusions about how year round access and frequency might play into prioritizing recreational amenities.

When asked about how needs are currently being met a number of items stood out. When added together people felt that their needs were being met regarding soccer/multi-purpose fields more than any other amenity. As mentioned before, building multi-purpose fields that are scheduled and maintained by the City is a high priority for the future. Respondents also felt like the city is meeting needs related to our golf course, skate park, tennis courts and baseball/softball fields.

While these responses make sense when comparing the number of these facilities we have compared to other communities, they don't take into account the QUALITY of the facilities. The golf course clubhouse has deferred maintenance issues, the baseball/softball complex is in need of upgrades to the mainline and irrigation infrastructure. So while we might be meeting the needs currently we will need to prioritize ongoing investment in our current facilities to ensure they continue to meet the needs of the community.

When asked about the biggest, single need in the community related to outdoor recreational amenities in Louisville respondents provided a wide variety of answers and individual comments to support their responses.

The number one need was additional tennis facilities. While this was rated number one, it should be noted that Louisville has more tennis facilities than NRPA standards and also than similar sized communities in Colorado. Other areas that ranked highly include multi-purpose fields and bike/pump track. The fourth highest category was "other" which allowed respondents to provide their own answer rather than the list of choices provided.

Some interesting responses included outdoor climbing structures, indoor tennis courts, public track and field facility, and a sledding hill. All facilities identified in this question should be included, at a minimum, in the conceptual design phase of any future park planning process.

Other factors will have to be taken into account as well including whether the use is compatible with the property and surrounding area, is it cost prohibitive, will it require specialized equipment or additional labor to maintain it and whether the amenities is supported by the public through the planning process.

Similar to the responses to the question related to the single biggest need, the responses to the allocation exercise indicated there was a desire to invest in tennis, multi-purpose fields, bike/pump tracks and our baseball/softball fields.

Comparative Data Analysis

The act of collecting comparative data is very important. Comparing the facilities we offer against other cities both locally, regionally and nationally can help us understand the areas we are meeting or exceeding what is generally provided, what areas that we are not providing a similar level of service as other municipalities and other types of facilities that we do not offer that we might want to include in our community to meet new needs.

In looking at the comparative data we compiled, three specific areas were identified in which we are below other entities at the local, state and national level. Those areas are multi-purpose fields, skate parks, and community gardens. Some other amenities were identified

in which we were equal to or above against one of the three data sets we compared to. The included Basketball, volleyball, pickleball, and baseball/softball facilities.

The comparative data also included information on expenditures per capita. As mentioned before, Louisville spends approximately \$124 per resident on parks, recreation and open space amenities. This is higher than the national average of \$78.69 per capita spending but less than the \$213 that the local and regional communities we compared ourselves to.

Next Steps/Conclusions


Further data collection in subsequent years will be helpful to determine trends over time. Also, comparing the amount of FTE's per acre of parkland or other metrics can further help provide context for our operations.

Based on this information I would say that Louisville has been able to leverage available funding to maximize the amenities offered in Louisville. Louisville is equal to or exceeds the amount of facilities we provide in a number of areas when compared to industry and local municipalities. But in order to expand or add new amenities it is likely that additional resources will be necessary and that working with PPLAB and the community to prioritize needs will be essential moving forward.





Q8 What is your Gender?



Q9 What is your age?



Q10 Number of years Lived in Louisville?




